The skating rink had an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) that had been donated by The Peyton Walker Foundation. Thanks to the quick actions of bystanders who intiated CPR and used the life-saving AED, Alicia was able to celebrate her 11th birthday with her family in April.



Community **Engagement**

- On August 1st, we participated in National Night Out in several communities throughout Central PA. Hundreds of community members visited with us to learn about CPR and AEDs and received information on how to prevent Sudden Cardiac Arrest.
- Through The 4-Minute City program we deployed over 200 AEDs into the hands of volunteers in Cumberland County. The goal of this program is to deploy AEDs throughout the county, so that there is an AED available within 4 minutes to all cardiac arrest victims.
- In October we launched our Protecting Hearts Saving Lives curriculum at Carlisle High School. Our 4-Step curriculum includes a presentation, videos, a quiz and hands-only CPR and AED usage.
- Together with Messiah University Men's Basketball team, we hosted the first annual Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Night on February 14 (shown below).
